NASHVILLE FLIER KILLED IN ALASKA

Sgt. Henry Shelia Jones Jr., 24 of the Army Air Forces, son of Mrs. Minnie Johnson Jones, 943 Bernard Avenue, was killed on December 30, 1942, when his plane was shot down while engaged in an attack on



Japanese shipping in Kiska harbor, Alaska, according to the letter of sympathy which has been received here by Mrs. Jones from the commanding officer of the bombardment squadron to which Sergeant Jones was attached.

The letter states that "Sergeant Jones...had gained the respect and admiration of

the officers and men who came to know him...shortly after leaving the harbor area his plane was shot down...May you be proud in knowing that your son unhesitatingly gave his life for his country."

Formerly of Cookeville, Tenn., Sergeant Jones was graduated from Hume-Fogg High School. He volunteered for service in the Army Air Forces in 1940, was stationed at MacDill Field, Tampa,

Fla., and later was graduated from, Casey Jones Aeronautic School, Newark, N. J. He was affiliated with the Waverly Place Methodist Sunday School and church.



Sergeant Jones' father, H. S. Jones Sr. died 10 days before his son's death. The flier is survived by his mother and two brothers, Carl Wade and Elba Ray Jones, both of Nashville.
