BLOOMINGTON: March 26. — **Oscar Jones, son of Joseph Jones, of this place**, was shot and instantly killed here yesterday afternoon at four o'clock by **Winton Johnson**. It has been hard to get at the facts that led to the killing. It seems that there had been bad feelings between the two parties prior to this time. However the evidence brought out by the Coroner's inquest was to the effect that Jones was in his father's barn, when Johnson passed by. He called to Jones to come out, at the same time abusing him. Some words passed between the two who were standing about ten steps apart. **Johnson drew his pistol and fired four shots, and then ran. Jones fell and only lived three minutes.** The shot which produced death entered his right breast and passed though the lung and came out. He was also shot through each hand. It was claimed that Jones did nothing but throw up his hands. In accord with this testimony the jury brought in a verdict that Jones came to his death by pistol shots fired by Winton Johnson and that the killing was premeditated murder in the first degree.

For some time after the killing Johnson remained in hiding, but this morning came to his father's home near here and sent word to **Sheriff Alcorn** that he would surrender. He was taken to Cookeville and lodged in jail. He will be given a preliminary hearing at this place next week.
